# The opportunities are endless. Join us!

I love to hear stories from people in the Easterseals organization. The most compelling are usually about the successes of the thousands of people we serve. I also love to hear from staff and get their perspectives on what's going well and what we can improve. Last week I met with the organization's vice presidents and many of the leaders who report to them – approximately 35 people. Through two hours of updates from various departments, we heard two recurring themes: 1. We have many talented, passionate, committed people working in this organization and 2. We need more!

We heard about individual successes – staff who completed certifications in record time, those working on degrees or receiving degrees, staff working together to implement new software or streamlining processes, staff working to increase engagement with families and exploring new treatment ideas or strategies, creatively revising roles and job descriptions for better outcomes, and filling staffing gaps with cross-training. Some of the innovative ideas we heard about were creating literary sensory and art boxes for early learners, obtaining grant funding to improve management training, and implementing new strategies to create a pipeline for hiring more therapists. From department to department, we heard about staff going above and beyond to overcome their challenges while focusing on creating the best service or outcome possible.

These stories are gratifying, to say the least.

The second common theme was we need more dedicated people who want to join our team to make a difference and help us continue to improve and expand our services. In our group home program, we need direct support staff and front-line managers who care about creating the best home-like environment where individuals' rights and choices are honored and protected. At the Early Learning Center, we need creative, energetic teachers to create a nurturing learning environment for kids of all abilities to prepare them for kindergarten. In our employment services program, we need a self-starter who can help us dream about what's possible and redesign services to help people with disabilities find jobs in the community that have meaning and purpose. We need speech therapists, audiologists and physical therapists to continue to expand essential therapy services, ensuring that people at all income levels have access to the highest quality services. We need people who want to build a career with Easterseals to help us prepare for the retirements of several therapists and leaders over the next 5-10 years.

At Easterseals we have a great culture that supports professional development and innovation and you can feel momentum building and shifting toward the future. Thanks to **ABC25/CW7**, the 2024 *Easterseals Telethon* reached viewers throughout the Tri-State on Friday, April 12. It was the 47th year the stations donated 100% of production and air time, allowing all proceeds to fund inclusive early education and essential therapies. The "final tote" of \$918,649 reflected a year of community support!

**Eyewitness News** team members hosted the show, which aired live from the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center. **Townsquare Media** stations 99.5 WKDQ, My 105.3, KISS 106, WBKR, and 103GBF also provided live coverage.

Viewers met Child Ambassador Eleanor Daywalt and Adult Ambassador Sage Hawkins. Their stories were told through compelling videos donated by Direction by Newman, ABC25 and CW7. Volunteers answered phones, groups contacted friends from the Dialin' & Duelin' call center, businesses and organizations presented checks, and Pacesetters reported on donations raised before the show. Donors gave at the Kaiser Aluminum "fishbowl" and E'ville Iron displayed street rods outside. Top Telethon supporters received Mayor's Awards, and Mayor Stephanie Terry proclaimed Easterseals Day in Evansville.
