
The Nashvillian of the Year is an annual fundraiser whose proceeds benefit the programs of Easterseals Tennessee.

Chosen by past Nashvillians, Easterseals Tennessee proudly celebrates and awards a recipient as the honorable Nashvillian of the Year. The honoree is selected for his/her leadership and impact within the community to philanthropic causes and to business development, helping ensure that Nashville continues to be a better place to live, work and prosper.

James E. K. Hildreth, Sr., Ph.D., M.D. has been selected as the 2024 Nashvillian of the Year.

James E.K. Hildreth, Ph.D., M.D. is the 12th President and Chief Executive Officer of Meharry Medical College, the nation's largest private, independent historically black academic health sciences center. Hildreth holds an MD from Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, a PhD from Oxford University, and a BA from Harvard University where he graduated as a Rhodes Scholar. A world-class infectious disease expert, Hildreth's ability to explain complex science to laypersons made him a national figure during the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2020, he was appointed to the FDA Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee and in 2021, he was named to President Joseph Biden's Health Equity Task Force. Hildreth spent 23 years at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine as student, postdoc, professor, associate dean, and served as Dean of the College of Biological Sciences at University of California, Davis. His HIV research resulted in 11 patents and international recognition for several key discoveries.

Dr. Hildreth was elected to the National Academy of Medicine and has received numerous awards and recognition for his accomplishments, leadership, and service. He was named Chairman of the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences Board of Trustees in 2019. In 2021, Dr. Hildreth was inducted into the Tennessee Health Care Hall of Fame. He has served on numerous national scientific councils including current membership on the Advisory Council to the NIH director. Hildreth currently serves as Chair of the Board of Trustees of the St Jude's Research Hospital Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences. He also serves on other boards including the Nashville Healthcare Council, Nashville Health, Boy Scouts of America, and the General Board of Higher Education of the United Methodist Church.

Given the choice and access, Brandon has discovered if he is willing to work hard and save his money, he will have a higher probability of accomplishing his goals. Little does Brandon know that Easterseals Tennessee is working on finding a matching gift donor to help support his dream of purchasing a guitar and an amplifier, along with any other accessories needed.

The immediate decision was to support the gentleman within the Easterseals TN Residential Living program, and a plan to develop the full details would come later. Phone calls were made and staff found the gentleman a place to stay for the first night.

After the initial night other housing options were needed for the coming weekend; two staff members volunteered their own homes. Ultimately, a weekend hotel stay, fully staffed by Easterseals TN was arranged for the gentleman. By Monday morning a new rental home was located, and the individual moved in by 1pm with staff supports.

An amazing story of caring and devoted staff making meaningful contributions in the lives of others. The gentleman, along with his conservator are praising the dedication of the unsung staff heroes.
