At least 70% of families in the Easterseals network use more than one service. They can get different kinds of support based on multiple needs.

7 in 10

For every 10 people we serve, 7 people identify as disabled. Easterseals fills service gaps many disabled people often experience.

Nearly 40% of all people supported by our services are early and middle childhood and middle adulthood age groups—helping ensure they get the strongest start in life.
